Collaborating for Farmland Access

There's a critical issue facing new and beginning farmers in Western New York — access to and ownership of farmland. For many farmers, owning land provides the security needed to invest in their businesses through infrastructure and capacity building. Knowing that resources won't be lost if a lease expires or can't be renewed provides farmers with the piece of mind needed to take essential next steps. Without access to land, new farmers face immense challenges in building sustainable, long-term businesses, which impacts us all by putting our local food system at risk.

The Loss of Farmland in Western New York

According to the Erie County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Plan, since 1970, Erie County has lost nearly 40% of its farmland to development, pushing food production farther from the County's population centers. Additionally, research by the Partnership for Public Good found that 20% of children are food insecure in Western New York, particularly in rural areas and communities of color. Farmland loss is deeply felt throughout our region and negatively impacts the health and well being of our community. Transitioning farmland to a new generation of farmers is key to building sustainable, resilient, and equitable local food production.

Overcoming Barriers and Keeping Farmland in Agriculture

At Providence Farm Collective (PFC), many of our farmers are actively working to secure farmland as they prepare to launch their agriculture businesses. Progress through opportunity has taken many forms in the programs and the partnership offered by PFC staff that include:

- Providing assistance to farmers as they apply for grants
- Connecting farmers to markets and resources through produce aggregation and bulk purchasing of materials and supplies
- Fostering network building for farmers through attendance at national conferences, connecting farmers with New York State's Department of Ag & Markets, and hosting onsite networking events
- Creating a farmland access strategic plan with input from stakeholders to support the success of farmers and their independent farm enterprises

Through our work as Regional Navigators with American Farmland Trust, we support our farmers in navigating the complexities of securing land and helping them explore options like cooperative farming, lease-to-own agreements, and land purchases. Of course, relationship building with local farmland owners who would like to keep their land in agricultural use through leasing or selling is key to our farmers' success.
